



INTERNET SAFETY TIPS

1 Creating a strong password requires incorporating numbers, uppercase letters, and special characters, as well as using tools that can simplify the process.

2 Providing personal information such as birthdates, email addresses, and family details can make it simpler for cybercriminals to infiltrate your account.

3 The use of "https" in a URL (Uniform Resource Locator) is more secure than "http" because the letter "s" denotes security.

4 To ensure you don't end up downloading a malicious program, it's recommended that you obtain any desired app or program through an official website.

5 It is advisable to avoid using debit cards directly linked to your bank account. Instead, limit yourself to having just one debit card for online transactions. Additionally, you may want to consider implementing an extra layer of security.

6 Google provides all its users with the option of using a code sent to their phone instead of simply typing in their password.

7 When you receive a message, take a moment to consider whether the sender is someone you recognize before clicking on any links in the message. Avoid clicking on links in messages from senders who are not familiar to you.
